The RDA network in SA

The Regional Development South Australia (RDSA) network of Regional Development Australia (RDA) organisations in SA are independent, non-partisan and receive funding from all three levels of government. We are well-placed in providing specific local intelligence to advance regional challenges and evidence-based decision making.

We aim to capitalise on regional SA's unprecedented opportunity for population and industry growth while focusing on bringing together data, policy, and solutions to key challenges to meet industry demands.

Regional SA – economic performance

The 2024 RDSA Regional Blueprint reflects a record year with headline GRP growing from \$31.78B to \$35.89B - highlighting the significant economic contribution regions make to the South Australian (SA) economy. Regional SA performs above the state average for labour productivity – higher than metropolitan Adelaide.

Record forecast pipeline of growth

An analysis of 928 public and private sector projects in the RDSA Regional Investment Pipeline highlights \$65.43B in Capital Expenditure (CAPEX) under contemplation in regional South Australia, up from \$62.562 last year. To be included in the pipeline, these investments must be under active contemplation, funding consideration and/or construction for commencement in the next five years.



RDSA Strategic Priorities

Infrastructure and Land Use Planning

To unlock investment opportunities, enabling infrastructure must be effectively coordinated across all levels of government. Fit-for-purpose infrastructure (water, power, transport, and telecommunications) is essential for growth and thriving communities.

Water

Regional SA faces critical challenges in water supply and stormwater/wastewater management due to dependency on water for growth and distribution constraints. RDAs support sustainable water use and infrastructure planning to address short, medium, and long-term needs.

Housing

Adequate housing in regional SA is vital for population retention, growth, and workforce supply. RDAs advocate for initiatives to unlock diverse, affordable housing options for critical workers, families, and ageing populations.

Workforce, Education, and Skills

Regional growth depends on attracting a skilled workforce, creating local education pathways, and addressing workforce shortages. RDAs advocate for solutions to bridge skills gaps, strengthen workforce retention, and foster vibrant communities.

Environmental Sustainability

RDAs champion sustainable development, rapid decarbonisation, and climate adaptation. They advocate for projects supporting drought resilience, water security, and net-zero transitions by 2050, ensuring long-term resource and ecological management.

Liveability and Regional Equity



Economic Growth and Diversification




Tracked Investment Projects




Pipeline Project Total Value (B)
